
We had over two dozen kinder practicing traditional German folk tanz's at practice on Monday February 5th. We all look forward to their debut!

How to make Traditional German Potato Salad

Submitted from the BSC Cookbook.
Recipe by Dolly Hamilton.

10 lbs. potatoes
1 c. onions, chopped
6 c. celery, chopped
1 ¼ c. oil (corn oil does not work well)
1 ½ c. vinegar
2 tbsp. salt
1 tbsp. sugar
Pepper to taste
1 c. bouillon

Cook potatoes with jackets on. Peel and slice while warm. Add onions and celery. Put oil, vinegar, salt, sugar and pepper in shaker or a container with a tight lid. Shake well and pour over potatoes, celery and onions. Toss with hands until well mixed. You could chop and dry a ½ pound of bacon and add to it if you wish.
